All India Institute of Medical Sciences

The AIIMS (All India Institute of Medical Sciences) was established in 1956, as an autonomous institution through an Act of Parliament and it conducted entrance test for the admission of students to the MBBS/BDS courses. Bachelor of Medicine and Bachelor of Surgery (M.B.B.S.) of the All India Institute of Medical Sciences shall last for a minimum of 5½ academic years including one year compulsory internship. The AIIMS, New Delhi is a residential University in which the faculty members, staff and the students live on campus.

Eligibility Criteria for AIIMS & Test Pattern of AIIMS

Eligibility Criteria for AIIMS

- The candidate should be a Citizen of India.
- The candidate should have attained or will attain the age of 17 years as on the 31st of December of the year of admission.
- Candidates should have passed the 12th Class under the 10+2 Scheme/ Senior School Certificate Examination (CBSE) or Intermediate Science (I.Sc.) or an equivalent Examination of a recognized University/ Board of any Indian State with ENGLISH, PHYSICS, CHEMISTRY and BIOLOGY as subject.
- General and OBC candidates who have obtained a minimum of 60% marks in aggregate in 4 subjects of ENGLISH, PHYSICS, CHEMISTRY and BIOLOGY are eligible for AIIMS test.
- For SC/ST/PWBD candidates should have secured at least 50% marks in aggregate of 4 subjects.

Test Pattern of AIIMS

The competitive Entrance Examination for admission to the MBBS Course for AIIMS New Delhi and other Eight AIIMS will be conducted through a Computer Based Test (CBT) [Online mode of examination].

The Online (CBT) Entrance Examination is proposed to be conducted in two shifts per day in different cities all over India on scheduled date and time as – Morning Shift: 09:00 AM to 12:30 PM | Afternoon Shift: 03:00 PM to 06:30 PM.

- The Competitive Entrance Exam for MBBS course will have one paper consisting of 200 Objective Type (Multiple Choice and Reason-Assertion type) questions from Physics, Chemistry, Biology and General Knowledge/Aptitude.
- The distributions of questions are as follows: Physics-60, Chemistry-60, Biology-60, General Knowledge and Aptitude & Logical Thinking-20 marks.
- Total no. of MCQs is 140 and R-A type questions are 60.
- Each correct response will get a score of 1 mark and each incorrect response will get a score of - 1/3 (minus-one-third). No credit will be given for the questions not answered and More than one response will be treated as wrong answer and negatively marked.
- The duration of the examination shall be 3½ hours (three hours and thirty minutes).
- Question paper will be provided either in English or in Hindi according to the choice of candidates.

Number of Seats & Reservation in AIIMS

There are a total of approx 807 seats offered by the AIIMS throughout the India. Under the Pradhan Mantri Swasthya Suraksha Yojana [PMSSY] eight new AIIMS have been established similar to AIIMS, New Delhi. The six AIIMS viz., Bhopal, Bhubaneswar, Jodhpur, Patna, Raipur and Rishikesh have been continuing with an intake of 100 students each from August 2013 and 50 students each in AIIMS Nagpur (Maharashtra) & Guntur (Andhra Pradesh) have been started from the Academic Year 2018-19 by the approval of the Ministry of Health & Family Welfare.

The 100 seats for Indian Nationals and 7 seats for Foreign Nationals are available for admission to MBBS course at AIIMS, New Delhi. And in other eight AIIMS, the reservation policy followed will be 7.5% ST, 15% SC and 27% OBC, for Indian Nationals. A 5% reservation for Person with Benchmark Disability (PWBD) as per provision of Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016 shall be provided on horizontal basis, amongst the seats available.

Minimum Cut-Off Scores for AIIMS MBBS Entrance Exam

The cut off score was the lowest possible score a candidate needed to secure in order to qualify the entrance exam. As per decision of the Governing Body, AIIMS, New Delhi dated 26.11.2009, the minimum cut-off necessary in the Entrance Examination to determine eligibility for admission is:

- **General Category : 50%**
- **OBC (Non Creamy Layer) : 45%**
- **SC / ST : 40%**
- **PWBD : Cut-offs of the respective category**

Since the examination held in two days in two shift per day, a Normalization Procedure will be used; the Percentile score corresponding to the above cut-offs will be used to determine eligibility.

In the event of the percentiles for the four shifts in two days being dissimilar / unequal, the lower of the four will be the eligibility cut-off for that category for all candidates (i.e. all shifts).
